Amendment 1 – Attachment A

CFOPD-19-R-015 – EFS Organization Change Management

Set forth below are the District's responses to Offeror questions:

1. The requirement for 750+ oracle cloud professionals can only be met by a small number of vendors, and very few that specialize in change management. Would the District consider removing this requirement?

Response:

Since the change management Contractor will partner closely with the implementation Contractor, it is imperative to select a Contractor equally versed in the Oracle cloud applications and change management. The District has determined that this requirement ensures that offerors submitting a proposal will demonstrate significant prior Oracle cloud implementation experience.

2. With respect to the cloud, given that the change management needs associated with Oracle implementations do not vary significantly in cloud versus non-cloud deployments, can respondents use large public sector Oracle deployments that are outside of the cloud as representative experience?

Response:

The change management work includes training about 900 District users. Without knowing the Oracle Cloud product, which has changed significantly in several areas, it would not be advantageous to the District's to select a Contractor with only Oracle non-cloud experience. Section M.3.1.2.1 of the RFP describes the qualifications and the points awarded based on differing criteria. A large public sector Oracle non-cloud deployment would meet the criteria for M.3.1.2.1.6, for example, but would not meet the requirement for M.3.1.2.1.5. The M.3.1.2.1.5 requirement includes either a public or a commercial Oracle Cloud implementation.

3. Would the District of Columbia consider a limitation of liability for direct damages? We would like to propose the following language: Except with respect to Contractor's obligations to provide indemnification pursuant to this agreement, the limit of liability shall be as follows: Contractor's liability for any damages arising out of, or related to the Agreement, whether in contract, tort or otherwise, shall in no case exceed direct damages in: (i) an amount equal to two (2) times the amount paid to the Contractor for work performed under this agreement, or (ii) two million (\$2,000,000), whichever is greater.

Response: The District may consider this request prior to award of a contract.

4. Solicitation section H.11.1: "The procurement process and the obligations imposed by District of Columbia law require the Office of the Chief Financial Officer, Office of Contracts to ensure that the competitive process operates in a fair and equitable manner. The EFS Contractor and OCM Contractor are excluded from participating in the solicitation for IV&V Services expected for this project."

Will the District consider awarding the EFS Contractor and the OCM Contractor procurements to one vendor?

Response:

The District will award the EFS Implementation contract to the offer deemed to be most advantageous to the District. The same holds true for the award for the EFS Organization Change Management. It is possible, but not required, that both contracts will be awarded to the same contractor.

5. Solicitation section C.6.1.2.m: "Develop and conduct OCM Training. The training material will include integrated end-to-end business process and role specific end-user training."

Will the District provide a Learning Management System (LMS) for training assignments, web-based training delivery, training reporting and other training management needs for all end users?

Response:

Section C.6.5.1 of the RFP, which describes activities during Blueprinting, includes the creation of an initial training strategy and plan (C.6.5.1.x). That plan shall "identify and document tools/software needed to conduct training and develop and maintain training material." The fitness of the OCFO's LMS for use in this implementation would be part of that activity.

6. Solicitation section C.6.1.2.n: "Maintain training environment(s) including creating user profiles, log-in credentials and transactional and master data to support training."

Will the District provide two or more training environments to support end user training development and delivery?

Response:

During Blueprinting, the EFS Contractor, the OCM Contractor, and the District will craft an instance or environment strategy to identify the number of instances needed – and their use – during implementation and post go-live.

7. Solicitation section C.5.1.x.1: "Develop and conduct OCM Training. The training material will include integrated end-to-end business process and role specific end-user training."

Does the DC OCFO have any preferred training development or delivery tools that the OCM vendor is expected to use as part of training development and delivery? (e.g., Oracle UPK, Articulate, Camtasia)

Response: No. The Blueprinting process (C.6.5.1.x) will allow the OCM

Contractor, the EFS Contractor and the District to determine the

appropriate tools to be used.

8. Solicitation section C.4.1.1: "Also included in the scope are three additional District organizations: Office of Lottery and Charitable Games, Events DC, and the United Medical Center (a nonprofit hospital)."

Which wave of implementation will the three additional District organizations (Office of Lottery and Charitable Games, Events DC, and United Medical Center) be a part of?

Response: During Blueprinting, the phasing of the clusters and these

organizations will be determined. These three organizations currently have interfaces into the SOAR system and will need to interface into

the new financial system.

9. C.6.1.2: "f) Develop new organization structure"

Does the District anticipate the implementation of the new organizational structure to occur simultaneously as the system is implemented?

Response:

Where the introduction of new business processes requires a new organizational structure coinciding with the implementation of the system, it may be appropriate for the new organizational structure changes to occur at implementation. In other cases, changes may precede implementation or may be implemented in phases following implementation. It is expected that the determination of the timing of organizational, process, and system changes will be part of managing and implementing change (C.6.1.2).

10. B.1: "Identifying efficiencies leading to re-engineering the business processes supporting the new systems"

What is the expected role of the EFS Contractor versus the OCM Contractor in reengineering business processes and identifying efficiencies?

Response:

As members of one project team, it is expected that both the EFS Contractor and the OCM Contractor would partner with the District to identify efficiencies and re-engineer business processes. The EFS Contractor would then configure the systems based on the decisions made and the OCM Contractor would integrate those efficiencies and new processes into the training materials, job-aids and presentations.

11. C.6.1.2.: "e) Develop Competency Framework"

Does OCFO have existing competency models/frameworks for potentially impacted positions (i.e. business, leadership, technical)?

Response:

The District will provide the current performance management documentation upon contract award as part of the Blueprinting process. It is anticipated in C.6.1.2.e that the OCM Contractor shall craft a competency framework based on the business processes and roles and responsibilities identified for financial accounting and reporting as well as planning and budgeting.

12. Does the OCFO have an existing online training platform and learning management system (LMS) that is preferred and available for use during this implementation? If so, what systems are they?

Response:

The OCFO uses MaxIT's LMS. See the response to question 5 above regarding the selection of the appropriate platform for this engagement.

13. We have capabilities to support the EFS Organization Change Management effort but as an SBE, are not in position to prime this contract. Would you be willing to provide the list of firms that have requested an invitation or expressed interest in responding to this solicitation to allow us to introduce our capabilities to them with the hope of subcontracting and supporting a potential prime's ability to meet H.3 requirements?

Response:

The District can only provide a list of Offeror's that were on the bidders list. Attachment B contains the list of bidders the District reached out to.
